Official Syllabus & Subject Breakdown Guide

The West Bengal Public Service Commission (WBPSA) Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) Supervisor examination requires an extensive, structured preparation approach. The syllabus is multidisciplinary, ensuring selected candidates possess robust foundational knowledge in general governance, social infrastructure, and specialized child development principles.

1. General Studies

This section evaluates the candidate's baseline awareness of historical, socio-economic, environmental, and political landscapes, with a focused lens on both the national perspective and the state of West Bengal.

History of India

- Ancient, Medieval, and Modern Indian History.
- Indian National Movement and the freedom struggle.
- Socio-religious reform movements in the 19th and 20th centuries.

Geography of India & West Bengal

- Physical, social, and economic geography.
- Natural resources, rivers, and climate patterns of India.
- Special emphasis on the demographic and geographical features of West Bengal.

Indian Polity and Governance

- **Early Childhood Education:** Importance of pre-school education, play-based learning methodologies, and cognitive stimulus frameworks.

Nutrition, Health & The ICDS Ecosystem

- **Nutrition and Health:** Balanced diets, macro/micronutrients, deficiency syndromes (PEM, Anaemia), and maternal health care guidelines.
- **Role of ICDS in Child Welfare:** Structural blueprint of ICDS, delivery of the 6 core packages (Supplementary Nutrition, Immunization, Health Check-up, Referral Services, Pre-School Non-Formal Education, Nutrition & Health Education).

3. Social Work & Welfare Schemes

Focuses on applied sociology, structural community assistance frameworks, and operational state/central intervention programs designed for marginalized demographics.

- **Basics of Social Work:** Concept, scope, and philosophy of social work in developing nations; ethics of community service.
- **Community Development:** Rural and urban community dynamics, mobilizing stakeholders, and addressing local infrastructural deficits.
- **Welfare Schemes and Policies:** In-depth study of social security measures, flagship schemes of the Government of India, and targeted welfare initiatives launched by the Government of West Bengal (e.g., Kanyashree, Rupashree, Sabooj Sathi).

4. Current Affairs

Candidates must remain continuously updated on dynamic macro-trends, policy shifts, and legislative advancements.

- **National and International Events:** Major political, economic, sports, and cultural events dominating global and domestic news.
- **Recent Developments in Child Welfare Policies:** New legislative acts, amendments to safety guidelines, budgetary allocations for women and child development, and newly introduced health portals/apps.
